Project Description: Spinal bulbar muscular atrophy (SBMA) is a genetic disease. It causes weakness, and difficulty with speaking, swallowing and breathing. Recently, we found a very high prevalence of SBMA in Indigenous people in Saskatchewan. Indigenous people affected by SBMA have told us of their wishes for more research. Wehave identified an approach called "photovoice" as a way to show the lived experience of people with SBMA. Pictures are used to show their lived experience. They then join group discussion with researchers. No studies to date have used the photovoice methodin SBMA. Our team's approach adapts photovoice to Indigenous methods. We will explore the findings from photovoice using sharing circles. This study will give voice to acommunity that has not previously been heard. It will increase awareness about SBMA in Indigenous communities. This will hopefully help SBMA patients get access to the resources they need.

conditions or life circumstances that First Nations, Inuit and Métis peoples may find themselves. There is much Indigenous health and wellness knowledge/ wisdom that has yet to be awakened or re-awakened, and such knowledge is not yet well-supported given the current colonized structures and conceptualizations. Awakening Indigenous health and wellness knowledge will require the reconstructing and re-development of community roles and wellness processes. It is within this context that we see Indigenous community as being the primary research leader, with the academy and the health system as being knowledge users.
